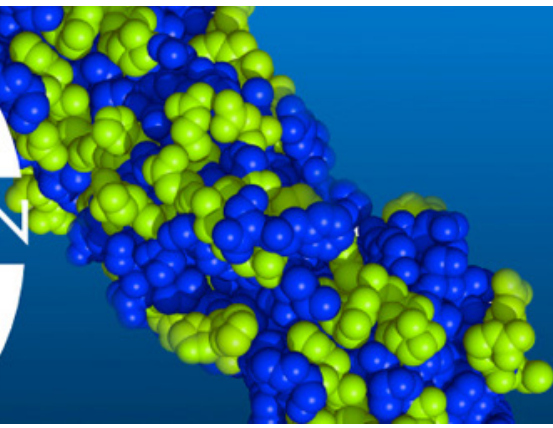


100 YEARS OF INNOVATION

William B. Lamb '63M, '65PhD, led a distinguished and dynamic career at DuPont for 35 years. Now retired as business manager of the packaging and films division, he progressed through the company via management positions.

Bill began his career as a research engineer in DuPont's film department laboratory in Tonawanda, NY, investigating and developing new packaging film for the industry. After 18 months he became research supervisor of the project and eventually transferred to Wilmington, DE, to supervise a different research group developing packaging film products and packaging machines.

Following a brief role in direct sales calling for the packaging films department, he continued his management career at the company's cellophane plant near Topeka, KS, and was promoted to plant technical superintendent.

Bill then returned to Delaware to work at the corporate office, where he split his five-year tenure between international planning and product development for the company's Teflon copolymer product line. He also spent a year in total quality management and was product manager of a new division created to market DuPont products to the wire and cable industry.

With international experience and extensive packaging background under his belt, Bill moved on to selling packaging products throughout Latin America. He then took on the role of regional sales manager for DuPont's packaging products before accepting his last position.

Since retirement in 2000, Bill has used his management expertise to help his current hometown of Plainfield, IL, as a member of the town village trustee and village board respectively.
